
Friends of Parkville Animal Shelter

CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON PLATTE LANDING PARK

A groundbreaking ceremony was held for the first phase of Platte Landing Park on September 26. Highlights of the event included Mayor Jim Brooks welcoming the public and offering opening remarks as well as Platte County 1st District Commissioner Beverlee Roper and 2nd District Commissioner Duane Soper recognizing special guests and donors who assisted with the project. Other community leaders who spoke at the groundbreaking in support of the project were Adam Zink (Chair, Community Land and Recreation Board), Deborah Butcher (Chair, Main Street Parkville Association), Audra Heller (President, Parkville Area Chamber of Commerce), and Roxsen Koch (Vice Chair, Parkville Economic Development Council).



Mayor Brooks welcomes the public to the Platte Landing Park Groundbreaking

The park is being constructed by Linaweaver Construction of Lansing, KS. The new park will comprise approximately 144 acres of riverfront west of Main Street in Parkville. The first phase of the park includes a boat ramp, a dog park with designated areas for large and small dogs, expanded parking for Grigsby Field, and the extension of the riverfront trail from English Landing Park. Construction on these elements will be completed in the spring of 2014. Future phases call for additional amenities including restored wetlands, recreational fields, a loop trail around the perimeter of the park, and a playground.

The park is a truly collaborative effort with funding and support from all levels of government (city, county, state, and federal). The City of Parkville will be responsible for the day-to-day maintenance, operations, and programming of the park. Platte County pledged \$1.5 million of the 3/8-cent parks sales tax funds for the planning, design, and construction of the park. The Missouri Department of Conservation and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security awarded \$750,000 in grants toward the construction of the boat ramp and related infrastructure. Special thanks goes out to the Heartland Tree Alliance and Hunt-Martin Materials for donating materials to offset the costs of the park construction.

BRINK-MYERS ROAD RETAINING WALL RECONSTRUCTION

The Brink-Myers Road retaining wall reconstruction project is approximately forty percent complete. The Judy Company, a local geotechnical contractor, is leading the rebuilding effort. The lower portion of the wall is re-using the stacked concrete blocks from the previous wall while the upper portion will be constructed from a stained and carved concrete material called shotcrete.

This shotcrete is meant to mimic the surrounding natural limestone once the wall is completed. The rebuilt wall will incorporate additional drainage components and numerous soil/rock anchors for long term strength and stability. The wall reconstruction is currently scheduled to be completed by mid November 2013.



DOWNTOWN MASTER PLAN

The City is working on a Master Plan to build consensus around a common vision for Downtown Parkville. The plan will address a variety of factors affecting the long-term success of downtown such as land use, development, character, appearance, housing, infrastructure, and preservation. The plan will blend public input with economic and engineering analysis to identify recommended strategies, policies, and plans for enhancing downtown. The transportation components of the plan will be based in large part on the Livable Communities Study that was concluded earlier this year. The Livable Communities Study is available on the City's website.

A project kick off meeting was held on September 4 at the American Legion and was well attended by over 80 participants. Two community forums were held concurrently on September 12, followed by a two day come-and-go design charette on September 17 and 18. The planning team expects to present preliminary concepts to the Planning and Zoning Commission and had scheduled work session with the Board of Aldermen October 15 to review all of the input gathered to date. The team is now working to finalize the plan document. If you have ideas or want to learn more, **signup and comment** on the interactive plan forum www.letstalkparkville.com. The final plan is scheduled to be presented to the Board of Aldermen at the regularly scheduled board meeting on November 19 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.

Parkville Symphonic Band




Sewer Billing Updates

Effective October 1, 2013, the City will begin applying a 10% late fee to all sewer bills that are past due. If a bill remains unpaid after 90 days, the City will cooperate with Missouri American Water Company to disconnect water service to the property. If water service is disconnected for non-payment, the full amount of the past due balance plus disconnection and reconnection fees must be paid before service will be reinstated. For a complete listing of the City's updated Sewer Billing Policies and Procedures, visit the website at <http://parkvillemo.gov/departments/sewer-utility-billing/>.

The City is taking these steps in an effort to collect over \$55,000 of unpaid sewer bills that have accrued since January. When sewer customers miss payments, the other customers to the utility are impacted because the costs must be absorbed through service reductions or rate increases. The goal is to be fair to everyone by enforcing timely payments. Customers with an inability to pay may be offered a payment plan or referred to social service agencies for utility assistance.

Automatic Withdrawals Now Available!

The City offers several convenient options for sewer payments. Payments may be made at or mailed to City Hall in form of check or money order. Cash payments should be submitted in person. Customers may also set up Automated Clearing House (ACH) withdrawals from a valid bank account. A form can be picked up at City Hall or is available on the website.

A customer must have a copy of the bill in order to make a payment.

Attention Landlords:

Did you know that the customer at the property receiving sewer service and the property owner are jointly responsible to pay for sewer services to the property? This means that landlords are ultimately responsible for uncollected sewer payments on tenant accounts. Property owners are encouraged to seek their own business and or legal advice to determine the best way to protect their interests.
