A NOTE FROM THE MAYOR

I can't believe that it has already been almost one year since I took office. I expect with the full slate of projects and events scheduled for 2015 that time will continue to fly by. With that in mind, I hope you will plan to attend one (or more) of the many community events this spring and summer. Highlights include the Parkville Mircobrew Festival, the Parkville July 4th Celebration, and Parkville Days. I'm particularly excited for this year's Parkville Days celebration because the city plans to bury a time capsule which will be opened on our 200th anniversary in 2049 (see page 9 for more details on the event and to submit your idea for the time capsule).

2014 was a move forward for Parkville! Two of 2014's major accomplishments include the grand opening of a brand new beautiful 140 acre park on the Missouri River and the completion of a market feasibility and economic impact study for the intersection of Interstate 435 and Highway 45. (See page 10 for more details on 2014 accomplishments).

2015 has already been a busy year! Parkville was recently awarded a \$40,000 Platte County Parks and Recreation Department outreach grant to help fund the English Landing Park Restroom Renovation Project, and the Mid America Regional Council Board of Directors awarded Parkville, Riverside, Park University, MoDOT, and Platte County a \$113,586 grant for the Route 9 Corridor Study (see page 6 for grant details).

Finally, the City extended yard waste collection! Beginning Monday, April 27 until Saturday, May 16 Parkville residents can drop off yard waste for NO CHARGE at 6305 NW Riverpark Drive. Drop off anytime Monday to Friday between 7:00 am - 4:30 pm (see page 4 for details and restrictions).

Extended Spring Yard Waste Drop Off!

Beginning Monday, April 27 until Saturday, May 16 Parkville Residents can drop off yard waste for NO CHARGE at 6305 NW Riverpark Drive. Drop off anytime Monday - Friday between 7:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Parkville Residents Only. Yard waste does not have to be bagged.

There is no Spring Clean Up this year. We encourage you to use this drop off service and to recycle materials at the Northland Recycling Extravaganza on Saturday, April 25.

Proof of residency is required. Sorry, no businesses. Acceptable documentation includes a Parkville Sewer Bill or Platte County paid property tax receipt that demonstrates a tax liability to the City of Parkville. A drivers license is not acceptable proof of residency.

ROUTE 9 ENTRYWAY PROJECT

Progress continues on the beautification of Route 9 from Coffey Road to the White Alloe Bridge. Improvements include a new sidewalk connection from 1st St. to the Train Depot, decorative street lighting with banner brackets, signage, and landscaping. Through a partnership with Park University, the project now includes 22 lights that extend just east of the main entrance to campus. Park University is sharing the annual maintenance cost in exchange for use of some of the informational banner brackets.

ROUTE 9 CORRIDOR STUDY

The Mid America Regional Council (MARC) Board of Directors recently awarded a \$113,586 grant for the Route 9 Corridor Study. The grant is matched by \$75,000 of local funding provided by Parkville (\$15,000), Riverside (\$15,000), Missouri Department of Transportation (MODOT) (\$20,000), Platte County (\$15,000) and Park University (\$10,000). Mayor Nan Johnston stated, "We appreciate cooperation from MARC and our partners on this project. Route 9 is a top transportation priority for Parkville, and this funding will help us take the next step toward implementing vital improvements along the corridor."

Route 9 connects vehicular and pedestrian traffic on Route 45 to employment centers and regional destinations including downtown Parkville, Park University, the Horizons, over 200 acres of parkland, the South Platte County Community Center and the

Platte County Health Department. The purpose of the Route 9 Corridor Study is to create an implementation plan that addresses the following key priorities for the project partners:

- Determine needed vehicular and pedestrian improvements to mitigate safety and capacity issues, and minimize traffic conflicts, on Route 9.
- Enhance aesthetics and pedestrian movements, particularly in proximity to downtown Parkville and Park University.
- Accommodate compatible new development and redevelopment along the corridor.
- Reduce future construction costs by facilitating the reservation of right-of-way for future improvements.
- Position the participating municipalities to compete in future transportation grant cycles for eligible improvements in the corridor.

All of these objectives are direct recommendations of previous public planning efforts including the Parkville Master Plan, the Livable Communities Study, and Vision Downtown Parkville, among others. The scope of work for the Corridor Study includes developing a construction phasing strategy for incremental implementation of improvements as funding and capacity allow. All phases, and projects within phases, will be priority rank-ordered based on need, urgency, feasibility, cost, economic impact, and overall benefit to the corridor in terms of resolving traffic conflicts.

The Mayor has appointed a steering committee of five voting members and six advisory members to guide the project. Opportunities for public input will be advertised via the City's website (www.parkvillemo.gov) and social media. The Corridor Study is scheduled to begin in May with final completion estimated by the end of 2015.

NO VISIT LIST

Both businesses and residents may apply to be added to the No Visit List. The No Visit List restricts visits by peddlers, solicitors, and canvassers. The list is provided to all applicants who receive a solicitor/peddler permit (includes canvassers) issued by the City, and it only includes the address of the residence or business. LICENSE YOUR PET!

Residents of Parkville are reminded that all dogs are required to get a license through the City of Parkville.

- Dogs over 6 months old must be licensed annually – New in 2015! Licenses are good for one year from date of purchase
- New fees effective January 1, 2015: Spayed or neutered pets get a reduced license fee of \$10; dogs not spayed or neutered are \$15
- Proof of current rabies vaccination within the last 3 years is required at time of application

 2. Provide proof of rabies vaccination
 3. Visit us at 8880 Clark Avenue to submit your application and payment (cash, check, money or credit card accepted – convenience fee applies to credit card payment)
 4. Dog tag is good for one year from the date of purchase
- For residents with a current license, renewal notices will be e-mailed one month prior to its expiration. If your pet has passed on, please notify City Hall.

REGISTER YOUR GOLF CART!

City ordinances allow residents to operate golf carts or low-speed vehicles on public streets within the Parkville city limits. Get registered today!

1. Complete the application
2. Inspect vehicles two years or older
3. Visit us at 8880 Clark Avenue to submit your application, proof of insurance, and proper inspections
4. Pay the license fee by cash, check, money order or credit card (convenience fee applies to credit card payments)

\$30 for 2-year registration per vehicle if registering 4 or fewer vehicles

\$20 for 2-year registration per vehicle if registering 5 or more vehicles

5. Post the decal received at City Hall on your vehicle clearly displayed on the back
6. Registration is good for 2 years from the time of submission. Renewal notices will be mailed (or e-mailed) one month prior to expiration

RENEW YOUR BUSINESS LICENSE BY MAY 31

The deadline to renew your business license for 2015-2016 is May 31, 2015. Renewal notices will be mailed in April to all Parkville businesses. WHAT IS NORTHLAND CAPS?

The goal of the Northland CAPS is to help high school juniors and seniors get ahead of the curve when they begin their college and career search. CAPS



offers interested and qualified students internships focusing on real world experience and professionalism in the workplace. Not only does it teach generalized professional behavior, but the program is split up into four different strands categorized by field: Technology Solutions, Engineering and Advanced Manufacturing, Medicine and Healthcare, and Global Business and Entrepreneurship.

The first semester of the course is primarily spent in one of the CAPS classrooms located in various businesses in the Northland. During this time the students are given an overview to their field of study, as well as a series of projects to allow students the opportunity to gain the confidence they need to conduct themselves in the real world. In the second semester of the program students get to put their newly learned skills to the test by interviewing for internship positions with companies and organizations throughout the Kansas City area.

This semester the City of Parkville is hosting two Northland CAPS interns. Each intern was assigned a specific city project to work on. Park Hill South senior Griffin Burri is working to create a volunteer database and coordination program called Volunteer Parkville. Griffin said that “the creation of a volunteer database will help the city, community partners, and community volunteers easily communicate and coordinate schedules. Additionally, the city and event organizers will also have the capability to collect basic information, liability waivers, and send out thank you notes to all volunteers for participating in any hosted activities.” Keep an eye out on www.parkvillemo.gov and the city's social media for updates as this project moves forward.

Park Hill South senior Lucia Mann is working on developing a time capsule that will be buried along with the completion of the Route 9 entryway project. The plan is to fill the time capsule during the annual Parkville Days Celebration. The City has asked committees, schools, and neighborhoods in Parkville to contribute items for the time capsule to let future Parkville residents know what was going on in the city in 2015. 2014 Highlights:

- Helped 18 needy children during the holiday season through Parkville's Shop with a Cop program.

- Facilitated adoption of Vision Downtown Parkville.
- Received a KCPL micro-grant for shade trees in the dog park.




NEW SHELTER RESERVATION PROCESS

There are three shelters at English Landing Park. They can be reserved in three-hour increments in four different time slots:

- 7:30 am to 10:30 am
- 11 am to 2 pm
- 2:30 pm to 5:30 pm
- 6 pm to 9 pm

The fee for the shelters varies, depending on the day of the reservation.

Non-Peak Days:

\$25 residents; \$35 non-residents

Peak Days:

\$50 resident; \$60 non-resident

The shelters can be reserved by completing the Shelter Reservation Permit located at www.parkvillemo.gov/shelter-reservations. It is recommended that you turn in your completed form in person at City Hall with the payment (cash, check or credit card – convenience fee may apply) in order to secure your reservation at the time of your visit. There are grills at the shelters for your convenience; there is an additional \$30.00 charge for the use of a self-contained BBQ Cooker.

The McKeon Stage and brick patio are now available for reservation on a daily basis, as well as the River stage. The fee for an event is \$400.00 (\$300 event; \$100 stage) for Parkville residents to reserve the stage and patio for one day and \$425.00 (\$300 event; \$125 stage) for non-residents. A \$25 application fee is non-refundable and is applied toward the event. The new Event Guidelines can be found at <http://parkvillemo.gov/guidelines-events-parkville/>. Contact City Hall at (816) 741-7676 to coordinate your event.

If you are unable to pay in person, please follow the instructions below:

1. Complete and sign the shelter reservation permit
2. Fax (816) 741-0013 or e-mail cityhall@parkvillemo.gov the application to City Hall (include "Park Shelter Reservation" as the subject)
3. Call City Hall at (816) 741-7676
4. Verify shelter is available
5. Make payment by credit card (convenience fee applies) at time of call
6. City staff will return the application, if approved, in the same method it was sent

Note: We recommend you call immediately if reserving by this method to verify the shelter is available. A reservation is not considered complete until the signed application is received at City Hall, the shelter is confirmed available, and payment is received. Payment will not be taken over the phone until steps 1-4 are complete (credit card information sent by e-mail will not be accepted per the Parkville Credit and Debit Card Handling Policy).
