ISSUE:
Approve an ordinance to appoint Greg Plumb as Ward 4 Alderman.

BACKGROUND:
Missouri statute RSMo 79.280 and Parkville Municipal Code Section 110.120 states that for vacancies in any elected office, the mayor shall call a special meeting of the Board of Aldermen to convene to nominate a successor with the advice and consent of a majority of the remaining members of the Board. The successor serves until the next general election. Since Nan Johnston was elected as mayor, a vacancy was created in Ward 4. According to statute the new mayor can nominate someone to fill the vacancy, and that person can be appointed by a majority of the board.

Mayor Johnston nominates Greg Plumb to fill the vacancy for Ward 4 alderman. He will serve until the second meeting in April 2015 following the next general municipal election, when the term expires.

BUDGET IMPACT:
There is no impact to the budget.

ALTERNATIVES:

1. Accept the Mayor's nomination by voice vote.
2. Reject the Mayor's nomination and request alternative nominations.
3. Postpone action.

POLICY:
Parkville Municipal Code Section 110.120 states the Mayor, with consent and approval of the Board of Aldermen, is to nominate a successor to fill elected office vacancies.

SUGGESTED MOTION:
I move that Bill No. 2774, an ordinance appointing Greg Plumb to serve as Ward 4 Alderman until the second meeting in April 2015, be approved on first reading.

I move that Bill No. 2774 be approved on first reading and passed to second reading by title only.

AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING GREG PLUMB TO SERVE AS WARD 4 ALDERMAN UNTIL THE SECOND MEETING IN APRIL 2015.

WHEREAS, former Ward 4 Alderman Nan Johnston was elected as Mayor at the April 8, 2014, general municipal election, leaving a vacancy for a Ward 4 alderman; and,


WHEREAS, the Mayor-elect has nominated Ward 4 resident Greg Plumb to fill said alderman seat until the second meeting in April 2015 following the general municipal election.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PARKVILLE, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Greg Plumb is hereby designated to serve as Alderman in Ward 4 to fill the vacancy created by former Alderman Nan Johnston's election to the office of mayor. The term of office shall be from this date until the second meeting in April 2015.


Section 2. This ordinance is effective upon its passage and approval.

I am known around the area as Greg.

I moved to southern Platte County (just west of Platte Woods) with my parents and younger sister in 1950s, starting 3rd grade at Graden Elementary School. I graduated from Park Hill High School in 1969. As a youth, I was active in Boy Scouts, and earned the Eagle badge, in Troop 333, which is still sponsored by Parkville Presbyterian Church.

I earned my B.A. in History & Economics from the University of Missouri in Columbia in 1973, and my J.D. from there in December 1975.

My wife, Michele, and I moved back to the Parkville area, renting apartments and duplexes in southern Platte County, until we purchased a home in the Walnut Creek subdivision, where we lived for 24 years. We raised our two children, Heather and Andrew there. I served on the homes association there, including one year as treasurer, where I handled all the books, wrote all checks (including payroll), and made monthly reports.

We moved into Riss Lake, purchasing our current home in November 2007. Michele and I, and our adult children, are all active members of St. Therese Church, where our older granddaughter attends kindergarten.

I was admitted to the law practice in Missouri in 1976 and began work in the Platte County Prosecuting Attorney's office, serving as Prosecuting Attorney in 1978.

I opened my private practice in southern Clay County, then moved my office to Parkville in the strip building in what is now Parkville Commons. While in private practice, I represented the Village of Randolph. In the almost fifteen years as the City Attorney, I assisted Randolph in moving to 4th Class City status, creating the police department with general orders and standard operating procedures, and creating their municipal court. I stopped practicing law in May 2000, to devote my full energies to college teaching.

I began teaching full-time at Park University in 1990, and continue there as a tenured full Professor of Criminal Justice. I have served in a number of administrative positions at Park, currently resuming the position of Chair of the Department of Criminal Justice.

I have been an active volunteer in Boy Scouting for almost 40 years, the past 20 spent mostly in training youth and adults at the local, regional, and national levels. I recently reduced my involvement in Scouting, having met all my personal goals and trained successors for my various positions, and am looking for new service opportunities.

My late father, Warren G Plumb, was active in community affairs, having served on the Park Hill School Board and the Mid-Continent Library Board. He was working with Parkville Mayor Jenkin David in establishing Parkville's Farmer's Market, when Mayor David died and Warren Gresham, as his successor as mayor, completed its establishment.
