### *A letter from the Mayor*


If you haven't been to English Landing Park this hot and dry summer, you probably have not seen the new stage that is being built. The previous Maxine McKeon Stage was washed away in last year's flood; the new one is not likely to ever wash away.

The stage is being constructed by local unemployed workers from the Platte County area under a federal program called the Disaster Relief Jobs Program (DRJP). Parkville was granted 35 workers for up to 1000 hours each, plus a generous tool allowance at absolutely no cost to the City. The work they are allowed to do must be related to clean-up and repair of last year's flood. The City has to pay for materials.

From the looks of it, this is a Federal program that works. These men and women were without jobs when they signed up for this program. They are now gaining experience by building the stage along with a number of other projects throughout English Landing Park, under the watchful eyes of Public Works Director, Kirk Rome, P.E., and Parks Superintendent, Tom Barnard.





## A warm winter and dry-summer help 45 Highway improvements

The hot, dry summer hasn't been all bad news. While we lament record high temperatures and record low-rain falls MoDOT has celebrated the extra work days created. "This weather's allowed us to move much faster on 45 Highway" said Chris Teel, MoDOT Senior Construction Inspector. The 45 Highway project includes safety improvements and widening along and between 9 Highway and Route K. The project was scheduled to be completed in summer 2013, but Ideker, Inc's Project Superintendent, Scott Lene said the "good" weather will allow them to complete the project by the end of the year. "The weather made a huge difference. It's been great. It may not be good for farmers but it's sure good for construction."

With a year-end completion scheduled, residents should expect a lot of construction activity this fall. Lene projected the start of Phase IV, the final phase, sometime in September. Starting in September, Blair Road will be closed for up to 30 days while its new alignment is being completed. Also in September, traffic will be separated west of the roundabout at the National with vehicles moved to outside lanes while inside lanes, medians and turn lanes are completed. Following in October, lane improvements and turn lanes will be constructed east of Bell Road and at the intersection of 45 and 9 Highways. As always, project schedules are weather dependent (so hope for more "good" weather).



Motorists will also see final construction of the street lighting and final traffic signal improvements before the end of the year. "The Bell Road traffic signal will be operational and all the signals will be coordinated at the end of the project" said Teel. He advised that motorists should expect periodic delays and temporary closures this fall and recommended motorists refer to the MoDOT 45 Highway project page at [www.modot.org/kansascity/major\\_projects/route45\\_000.htm](http://www.modot.org/kansascity/major_projects/route45_000.htm) for updated information on closings, detours and anticipated delays. ## Downtown Parkville Livable Community and Multi-Modal Study

The City of Parkville applied for and received a grant through the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) to study ways to make downtown Parkville more livable with an emphasis on transportation and multi-modal improvements. This is the first grant of its kind awarded to a community for a study of its kind. The City hired TranSystems Corporation as the studies consultant and they have begun collecting field data as well as begun efforts to gain input from the public through the [www.letstalkparkville.com](http://www.letstalkparkville.com) website and stakeholder meetings. Once TranSystems has gathered all of the input, they will be presenting ideas to the public for additional input and discussion prior to preparing their finished report next spring. We are looking forward to the report providing recommended improvements in a prioritized order and basic estimates of cost to assist with future budgeting.

## English Landing Park flood repair / Disaster Recovery Jobs Program (DRJP)

Last Fall the City applied for and received a federal grant to assist in disaster areas as part of the Federal DRJP program for flood damage repairs to English Landing Park. This DRJP program is administered by the Missouri Department of Economic Development and locally by the Full Employment Council and puts local unemployed workers back to work in disaster areas, thereby providing assistance to local families, the local economy, and the City by repairing flood damage in the park. The City also received over \$220,000 in FEMA flood damage grant assistance for cleaning up and making repairs to English Landing Park as well as flood response reimbursement.

In the spring, approximately 35 DRJP workers started on a long list of projects. The largest of these projects included rebuilding the two playgrounds, planting 120 new trees, rebuilding the McKeon stage, rebuilding Grigsby Field, removal of tree debris, trail reconstruction in the Sullivan Nature Sanctuary, and rebuilding the sand volleyball courts. The DRJP grant also pays for many of the tools and equipment to complete these projects. The City's responsible for purchasing the materials to complete the projects. The City has been careful to use flood resistant materials to the extent possible, such as reinforced concrete and steel in the rebuilt McKeon stage, replanting flood tolerant trees, and building trails with a rock base.

We have had numerous donors including Friends of Parkville Parks, the Turkey Trot Board and Ken Parrish, Kat Nurseries, and Reddmann Farms in Arkansas, a friend of CLARB Board Chairman Adam Zink. We would like to thank everyone that has assisted with their generous donations! We are looking forward to officially dedicating the rebuilt McKeon stage at Parktoberfest on October 6th!



## BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR AND STEWARD OF YOUR FAMILY PET

The following is a summary of the City of Parkville's Animal Regulations, the complete list may be found on the City website under City Ordinances, Chapter 210 of the City's Municipal Code.

- **LIMITATION ON NUMBER OF DOGS AND CATS** - No household shall keep more than three dogs or three cats, or any combination of such animals exceeding three in number.
- **ANNUAL LICENSE** - The City of Parkville requires that all dogs be licensed annually, beginning May 1. License fees are \$5.00 for each spayed or neutered male or female and \$10.00 for each un-neutered male or un-spayed female.
- **DOG TAGS** - Once the license has been issued, the owner will receive a metallic tag for the dog.
- **DOGS AT LARGE PROHIBITED** - Dogs are not allowed to be found outside of the residence structure of the owner, keeper, or harbinger and not effectively physically restrained on a chain or leash, or behind a suitable fence or other proper method of physical restraint from which it cannot escape.
- **IMPOUNDMENT OF LICENSED DOGS** - If a dog is "roaming the neighborhood" or is determined to be a public nuisance, the dog will be humanely handled by the Police Department or any animal control officer. There will be a fine for such offense: First Offense - \$15.00; Second Offense - \$25.00; Third Offense - \$50.00; Subsequent Offenses - \$100.00. Upon payment, the dog will then be returned to the owner or keeper.
- **IMPOUNDMENT OF UNLICENSED DOGS** - If a dog is obtained by the Police Department or animal control officer, and the licensed applicant, owner, or keeper cannot be found, and the dog is not wearing a collar with the provided dog license tags, the dog will be impounded at a suitable place.
- **ANIMALS CAUSING A DISTURBANCE OR NUISANCE** - No person shall keep any animal that:
  - Annoys or disturbs others with loud, frequent or habitual barking, howling, or yelping
  - Habitually jumps upon or threatens others on public streets, causing them to be in fear of injury
  - Spreading garbage or attacking other domestic pets or fowls
  - Commits any other acts defined in the definition of public nuisance.
- **DEFINITIONS** - An animal is defined as a public nuisance if it:
  - Molests any passerby or chases passing vehicles including bicycles
  - Attacks any other animal
  - Is at large in violation with Sections 210.020 or 210.200
  - Barks, whines, or howls in an excessive fashion to disturb the peace or quiet of a neighbor
  - Is ridden on public property and obstructs or interferes with vehicular or pedestrian traffic
  - Causes injury to any person
  - Threatens or causes a condition which endangers public health
  - Impedes refuse collection by ripping any bag or tipping any container of such
  - Damages private or public property, soils, defiles, or defecates on private property other than the owner's or on public walks and recreation areas unless such waste is immediately removed and properly disposed of by the owner.
- **DOGS WITHOUT CURRENT VACCINATION** - No person shall keep a dog that has not been vaccinated within three years immediately preceding the date of the alleged offense.



Please review and familiarize yourself with the City of Parkville's Animal Regulations as these are very important guidelines for our neighborhoods.
