INTRODUCTION

- Two Ways to Look at City Activities
 - Day-to-Day
 - Patrol the streets, maintain the parks, maintain the streets, plow snow, treat the sewage
 - A hundred other things, major and minor
 - Has to be done well: day-after-day
 - This is the expectation of residents... and the Board of Aldermen and staff
 - Significant Projects
 - Capital projects and major plans
 - They reflect the vision of residents, elected officials and staff
 - They take time and resources
 - These move us forward, make the community more livable, prosperous, charming







DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS

- Not as glamorous as projects, but the heart and soul of what we do
- It requires:
 - Dedicated, skilled staff
 - High functioning support systems
 - Equipment
 - Leadership put staff in position to succeed
 - Accountability
 - Open, two-way communication with residents
- Always looking for how we can improve our day-to-day services
 - Not just good, sound service, but also innovative







DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS

- Working to improve our day-to-day services
 - SeeClickFix Online Non-emergency Issue Reporting System
 - 293 requests in 2024, closed all but 4
 - 80 requests through Feb 14th in 2025, mostly snow-related
 - Snow, curbs & gutters, code enforcement, potholes are the biggest concerns
 - New ways to improve street maintenance and determine locations
 - Digital assessment and database of street, curb and sidewalk condition
 - Crack sealing
 - New overlay materials coming this year UBAS (ultra-thin bonded asphalt surface)
 - Increased focus and resources for curbs, sidewalks and trails
 - Parks
 - New park and recreation programming and events
 - Online park reservations
 - Continuous minor improvements in the parks
 - Landscaping
 - Drinking fountains (for humans and pooches)
 - Nature sanctuary restoration and trails









DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS

- Working to improve our day-to-day services
 - Police
 - Number one priority is to hire more police officers
 - Equipment and technology
 - New police cars
 - In car laptops connecting officers to a host of online resources including:
 - CrimeStar report system
 - Flock camera system
 - Axis camera system
 - Mobile ticketing
 - Dispatch Call for Service system (CAD)
 - GIS records system
 - All due to the passage of Prop P Thank You!
 - Continuous update of our development ordinances
 - Tree preservation
 - Design and landscaping standards
 - Online building permits and zoning applications
- Never satisfied, always looking to do better
 - Especially based on residents' feedback regarding needs and desires









MAJOR PLANS AND PROJECTS



- Plans Big and Small
 - We anticipate completing the Park & Recreation Master Plan this summer
 - A guide for use of the Park Sales Tax
 - The heart of the Highway 9/Downtown planning and design work will occur this year
 - Public input and important decisions on what improvements to make
 - Public input has been clear this is an important and expensive project, make it count
 - We will begin a planning study for the I-435/152 area this year
 - Plans to connect gaps in sidewalk system and study of Crooked Road
 - Citywide stormwater plan
 - ADA Plan starting with downtown
- Major Projects
 - The Farmers Market Shelter Structure Spring/Summer 2025
 - Bell Road Sidewalks 2025-2026 (currently being engineered)
 - Continued street overlay program and more attention to curbs and sidewalks







MAJOR PLANS AND PROJECTS

- Major Projects
 - Highway 9/Downtown Design 2025/2026; construction 2027/2028
 - New police substation at Creekside June 2025
 - New equipment and technology for police 2025 (in process)
 - Includes training officers in how to use effectively
 - Begin implementation of Park & Recreation Master Plan 2025
 - Park projects in progress
 - Continued maintenance and development of wetlands
 - Widening Main Street bridge
 - White Alloe Creek bank stabilization
 - Redeveloped train depot Spring 2025
 - Wayside horns downtown 2025/2026
 - Additional improvements to the Veteran's Memorial 2025/2026
 - Updated audio/visual equipment and layout for City Hall Board Room 2025










MAJOR PLANS AND PROJECTS

- One Additional Thing
 - In 2024 Parkville acquired its own GIS capacity for the first time
 - This capacity will help both our day-to-day operations, as well as major projects
 - 2025 is when we will start seeing the fruits of GIS
 - Maintenance status of streets, curbs and sidewalks online maps
 - Will help police officers and street crews
 - Most excited about the development of public dashboard that will allow the public and elected officials to track all the different projects the City is working on along with the current status of the project and anticipated next steps.
