

Parkville operates under a Mayor-City Administrator-Aldermen form of government. The mayor is elected atlarge for a three-year term and two board members are elected for two-year terms from each of the City's four wards.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen provide leadership in setting and achieving community policy, establishing the budget and hiring the administrator/department heads. They are committed to providing efficient and quality services essential to the quality of life citizens enjoy in Parkville.

History

Originally a steamboat landing, Parkville began to take shape when Colonel George S. Park purchased the site in 1838 and built his home on the bluffs above the Missouri River. In 1844, Park formally platted the town of Parkville and by 1850, a thriving community existed on the banks of the Missouri River. By the 1850s Park had built a hotel known as "Old Number One", which for a while was used as Park College. Park's dream for a college was realized in 1875 and students helped build many of the structures on campus. By 1877 there were general stores, a shoe store, grocery, hardware, blacksmith shop and two hotels. Many of those little shops and stores are home to today's shops and restaurants. In 1880, Parkville's population stood at 482. Parkville has survived through floods, train derailments and controversial issues and is now known regionally for the exceptional quality of life the community has to offer.



About your Community

Municipal Services and Utilities

The City of Parkville provides many municipal services including police, public works, parks, community development and municipal court. The City provides public wastewater services for a majority of the city. Water services are provided by Missouri American Water.

Transportation and Facilities

Parkville is located near Interstate 435, Interstate 29, Interstate 635 and Missouri Route 152. Missouri state highways 45 and 9 also bisect the city. Residents have a short commute into downtown Kansas City, the Kansas City International Airport and Kansas City's Downtown Airport.

Educational Facilities

The City is served by the Park Hill School District, which currently holds an "accredited with distinction" rating from the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, which is the highest attainable rating. Residents have easy access to several colleges and universities for undergraduate, graduate and continuing education opportunities. The city is home to Park University, a private, four-year institution founded in 1875.


Recreational Facilities

Spring and Fall Cleanup	The City of Parkville holds cleanup events annually in the spring (April) and fall (October). Items collected include:

Curbside Pickup	The City provides curbside pickup services annually in the fall for yard debris including leaves, small limbs and grass clippings. Items must be placed on the curb by 7 a.m. and must be able to be carried by one person. Yard waste must be bagged and limbs must be bundled at a maximum length of 4 feet.		
Yard Waste Drop Off	Parkville residents can drop off yard waste at no charge at 6305 NW River Park Drive annually during a 5 ¹ / ₂ -week period in spring and fall. Yard waste does not have to be bagged.		
Regional Yard Waste & Brush Drop Off	The City participates with Gladstone, Pleasant Valley, Liberty and Lake Waukomis to give residents the opportunity to drop off yard waste and brush throughout the year at the Regional Brush/Yard Waste Recycle Facility at 4000 NE 76 th Street, Gladstone. The program is available from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. to residential customers on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Yard waste must be bagged (charge per bag, truck and/or trailer). Proof of residency is required.		
Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)	Parkville and Platte County are members of the Mid-America Regional Council Solid Waste Management District's HHW Program. Items accepted include paint, automotive products, antifreeze, batteries, CFL light bulbs, fertilizers, hazardous cleaners, household cleaners, pool chemicals and used oil/thinners. Residents may also deliver HHW-acceptable items on Thursday and Friday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. throughout the year at the HHW Center at 4707 Deramus Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri. Proof of residency is required.		
Electronics Recycling	On the 1 st Saturday during even months from February to October, the City partners with a local electronics recycling vendor to collect anything with a cord or battery (working or not) during electronics recycling events in the parking lot at Barkville in Platte Landing Park. They are open to everyone. Most items can be recycled for free, but some items are charged a fee to recycle.		
Paper Shredding	In conjunction with the electronics recycling events, the City offers residents the opportunity to recycle paper on-site. The City partners with a local shredding vendor to provide secure shredding services. Proof of residency is required.		



Public Safety





The Parkville Police Department provides comprehensive law enforcement services to Parkville, approximately 14.79 square miles with a total population of 6,949 residents (US Census, July 2018 estimate). The Department patrols five state highways and one major interstate. When fully staffed, the department has 17 sworn officers and one civilian employee and handles a broad variety of calls for service, as well as traffic enforcement for the City of Parkville. <u>parkvillemo.gov/departments/police-dept/</u>.

The Parkville Police Department serves as the City's emergency management agency and Captain Jon Jordan serves as the Parkville Emergency Management Director. ANIMAL CONTROL

Residents are only allowed to have three dogs or three cats or a combination limited to three per residence. Dogs over 6 months old must be licensed and have a current rabies vaccination. Dogs must be leashed and loose animals will be picked up. The Police Department oversees animal control in Parkville. parkvillemo.gov/residents/dog-licenses/

BUILDING PERMITS

Building permits are required for new construction, tenant finish, demolition, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing and other items including additions, alterations, remodeling, repairing or roofing. parkvillemo.gov/business/development-permits/

DOOR-TO-DOOR SALES

Parkville Municipal Code Chapter 610 allows personal contact with a Parkville resident at his/her residence or a Parkville business without prior specific invitation or appointment from the resident or business. A permit is required before someone can go door-to-door in Parkville. DRIVER'S LICENSES, VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND LICENSE PLATES

The Missouri Department of Revenue License Bureau is located at 6400 N. Cosby, Kansas City, Missouri 64151. The bureau can issue state identification, driver's licenses, motor vehicle registration and license plates. New state residents may obtain a tax waiver from the Platte County Assessor's Office. <u>dor.mo.gov/motory/</u>

GOLF CARTS/LOW-SPEED VEHICLES

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE

The Property Maintenance Code ensures public health, safety and welfare of the residents and applies to all existing residential and non-residential structures and all existing premises and outlines minimum requirements and standards for premises, structures, equipment and facilities for lights, ventilation, space, heating, sanitation, protection from the elements, life safety, safety from fire and other hazards and for safe and sanitary maintenance. It is the responsibility of the owners, operators and occupants to comply with the Code. <u>parkvillemo.gov/departments/communitydevelopment/</u>

Short-term residential dwelling rentals are allowed in residential districts with City approval. parkvillemo.gov/business/short-term-rentals/.

SIGNS

Signs on public property require a sign permit from the Community Development Department and cannot be attached to any public utility pole, in the street right-of-way or in the median, or on public property. Signs can be placed on private property only with the property owner's permission and must not exceed six square feet in total.

Board of Appeals	Considers applications for appeal where it is alleged that the true intent of the adopted Property Maintenance Code or its rules have been incorrectly interpreted, its provisions do not fully apply and its requirements are adequately satisfied by other means.
Board of Zoning Adjustment	Parkville Municipal Code Section 401.030: Acts on appeals of decisions made by staff in enforcement of the Zoning Code, variances not contrary to public interests and in cases when enforcement of the Code will result in unnecessary hardship; special exceptions and other considerations as authorized by the Board of Aldermen.
Diversity & Inclusion Commission	Parkville Municipal Code Chapter 154: Acts in advisory capacity to promote community awareness and education on the value of diversity; promotes equity; evaluates and develops actionable equity recommendations to be used to examine and strengthen policies; promotes responsiveness of government; encourages continuation and creation of community equity, diversity and inclusion awareness efforts; and addresses ad hoc requests related to diversity and inclusion.
Community Land & Recreation Board	Parkville Municipal Code Chapter 150: Acts in advisory capacity to review matters of park planning or other issues brought before the Board of Aldermen related to parks; and makes recommendations regarding public neighborhood beautification project requests, event approvals on public right-of-way and park land; and procedures for carrying out such events.
Planning & Zoning Commission	RSMo 89.320 and Parkville Municipal Code Chapter 152: The Commission reviews and makes recommendations on zoning, subdivision plats; development plans; zoning and subdivision text amendments; adoption, periodic review and updates of the City's Master Plan; and other related activities.
Ethics Commission	Parkville Municipal Code Section 107: Has the power to render advisory opinions to the Board in all ethics complaints and to investigate and report on allegations of violations of the Code of Ethics and ordinance provisions concerning conflicts of interest and financial disclosure by all elected and appointed officials and all employees of the City.
Industrial Development Authority (IDA)	RSMo 349.010: Promotes and coordinates with industry, labor and trade associations and governmental agencies to promote trade, industrial and business development, industrial parks, ports and adjuncts thereto; conduct studies and investigations regarding establishment of industrial parks and ports, improving trade and industrial and business development; and promote and solicit industrial and economic development projects.
Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Commission	The Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Commission permits the use of a portion of local property and sales taxes to assist funding the redevelopment of certain designated areas within your community. Areas eligible for financing must contain property classified as a "Blighted", "Conservation" or an "Economic Development" area, or any combination thereof, as defined by Missouri statutes.



Enjoy Parkville

Parkville's historic riverfront and downtown are an eclectic mix of recreation, education, shopping and entertainment. Residents and visitors can enjoy five parks, two nature sanctuaries and miles of trails.



English Landing Park

English Landing Park is a 68-acre facility with several amenities, including three miles of walking trails, certified 5k/10k course, large playground area, five picnic shelters (three accept reservations), two stages, sand volleyball courts and a disc golf course. The park, with its scenic walking trails that parallel the winding Missouri River, is like none other in the metro area.

Platte Landing Park

Platte Landing Park is a 140-acre park located adjacent to English Landing Park on the Missouri River and includes two miles of trails, off-leash areas for dogs and a new boat ramp into the main channel of the Missouri River. The park is a cooperative effort between Platte County and the City.





Nature Sanctuary

The Parkville Nature Sanctuary is a 115-acre wildlife preserve and educational site made accessible by nearly three miles of hiking trails. The Sullivan Nature Sanctuary is 7.63 acres and is located on the north side of Platte Landing Park along Rush Creek.

Historic Downtown

Neighborhoods

The Bluffs

The Bluffs is located just west of downtown Parkville nestled in the forest up the winding bluff roads overlooking the Missouri River. Homes throughout the neighborhood have very unique architectural designs.





Creekside

Located at the intersection of I-435 and Highway 45 in western Parkville, Creekside offers a variety of homes, including single-family, townhomes and apartments, on nearly 300 acres.
